

Amendment to Registry Agreements

THIS AMENDMENT (“Amendment”), effective as of _____ (“Amendment Effective Date”), is made by and between the Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (“ICANN”) and LPL Holdings, Inc. (“Registry Operator”), and shall amend the Registry Agreement for certain top-level domains (“TLDs”) in the manner as further detailed and described herein.

WHEREAS, Registry Operator (i) is party to the Registry Agreements identified in Appendix I (each, a “Registry Agreement”) and (ii) is the Registry Operator of those TLDs identified in Appendix I to this Amendment, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, in the interest of the mutual of convenience of the parties, in lieu of executing an individual amendment to the Registry Agreement for each individual TLD identified in Appendix I, the parties hereby desire to consolidate the modifications as provided in this Amendment.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties, intending to be legally bound, agree as follows:

1. Registry Operator represents it has proper authority to execute this Amendment for the purposes intended.
2. The Registry Agreement for those TLDs identified in Appendix I shall be amended in the manner set forth below as the amendment number provided in Appendix I.
3. The parties hereby agree to amend Exhibit A of each of the Registry Agreements identified in Appendix I by deleting the following sections 3, 4, and 5 in their entirety:

“3. Searchable Whois

Notwithstanding anything else in this Agreement, Registry Operator must offer a searchable Whois service compliant with the requirements described in Section 1.10 of Specification 4 of this Agreement. Registry Operator must make available the services only to authenticated users after they logged in by supplying proper credentials (e.g., user name and password). Registry Operator must issue such credentials exclusively to eligible users and institutions that supply sufficient proof of their legitimate interest in this feature (e.g., law enforcement agencies).

4. Regular Expression Domain Name Blocking

Registry Operator may offer the Regular Expression Domain Name Blocking service, which is a registry service that allows an authorized representative from the sponsoring Registrar to request the blocking of domain names based on a regular expression specified for a base domain name.

- 4.1.** The Registrar using an offline process, requests the activation of the Regular Expression Domain Blocking service.

- 4.2. An attempt to register a domain that matches the expansion of the regular expression returns "not available for policy reasons".
- 4.3. The Whois service will return a message that explains that the domain name is blocked because of Regular Expression Domain Name Blocking specified for a base domain name. A reference to the base domain name must be displayed in the Whois output. For the absence of doubt, the registration data of the base domain name shall only be displayed when querying for the base domain name.
- 4.4. Names matching the expansion of the regular expression must not be activated in the DNS.

5. Internationalized Domain Names (IDNs)

Registry Operator may offer registration of IDNs at the second and lower levels provided that Registry Operator complies with the following requirements:

- 5.1. Registry Operator must offer Registrars support for handling IDN registrations in EPP.
- 5.2. Registry Operator will not offer variant IDNs.
- 5.3. Registry Operator may offer registration of IDNs in the following languages/scripts (IDN Tables and IDN Registration Rules will be published by the Registry Operator as specified in the ICANN IDN Implementation Guidelines):
 - 5.3.1. Spanish language"

The parties hereby further agree to amend Exhibit A of each of the Registry Agreements identified in Appendix I by replacing the deleted sections above with the following new text as new sections 3 and 4:

[START NEW TEXT]

"3. Regular Expression Domain Name Blocking

Registry Operator may offer the Regular Expression Domain Name Blocking service, which is a registry service that allows an authorized representative from the sponsoring Registrar to request the blocking of domain names based on a regular expression specified for a base domain name.

- 3.1. The Registrar using an offline process, requests the activation of the Regular Expression Domain Blocking service.
- 3.2. An attempt to register a domain that matches the expansion of the regular expression returns "not available for policy reasons".
- 3.3. The Whois service will return a message that explains that the domain name is blocked because of Regular Expression Domain Name Blocking specified for a base domain name. A reference to the base domain name must be displayed in the Whois output. For the absence of doubt, the registration data of the base domain name shall only be displayed when querying for the base domain name.
- 3.4. Names matching the expansion of the regular expression must not be activated in the DNS.

4. Internationalized Domain Names (IDNs)

Registry Operator may offer registration of IDNs at the second and lower levels provided that Registry Operator complies with the following requirements:

4.1. Registry Operator must offer Registrars support for handling IDN registrations in EPP.

4.2. Registry Operator will not offer variant IDNs.

4.3. Registry Operator may offer registration of IDNs in the following languages/scripts (IDN Tables and IDN Registration Rules will be published by the Registry Operator as specified in the ICANN IDN Implementation Guidelines):

4.3.1. Spanish language”

Each party hereby acknowledges and agrees that this Amendment shall not be construed as a waiver of any provision of the Registry Agreements by any party hereto, nor shall it in any way affect the validity of, or the right of any party hereto, to enforce the provisions of the Registry Agreements. The parties agree that, except as set forth in this Amendment and any prior duly authorized and executed amendments, the current terms and conditions of each Registry Agreement will remain in full force and effect. All capitalized terms not defined will have the meaning given to them in each Registry Agreement. This Amendment may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of such counterparts taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument.
