RE: Request for Exemption from Registry Operator Code of Conduct

Politie Nederland _____ (“Registry Operator”), in connection with the execution of the Registry Agreement for the _____ TLD (the “Registry Agreement”), hereby requests an exemption from the obligations of the Registry Operator Code of Conduct set forth in Specification 9 to the Registry Agreement (the “Code of Conduct”). Pursuant to such request, Registry Operator confirms that each of the following statements is true and correct (collectively, referred to as the “Statements”):

1. All domain name registrations in the TLD are registered to, and maintained by, Registry Operator for the exclusive use of Registry Operator or its Affiliate (as defined in the Registry Agreement);
2. Registry Operator does not sell, distribute or transfer control or use of any registrations in the TLD to any third party that is not an Affiliate of Registry Operator; and
3. Application of the Code of Conduct to the TLD is not necessary to protect the public interest for the following reasons:

The “.politie” Top Level Domain (TLD) is established by and is intended for use on behalf of Politie Nederland only.

The registration of domain names within the “.politie” TLD shall be restricted to Politie Nederland. This also state in the AGB question 18(B) “Since the “.politie” TLD will only register domains for its own usage and with only the police as the registrant there will no ‘social costs’..”

Politie Nederland will remain the registrant for all domain name registrations within the TLD, and shall retain the authority to modify or terminate such registrations at any time via the concerned registrars.

A restrictive registration policy ensures that all the second-level domains in the gTLD are managed by the Dutch Police and this in turn provides an opportunity for creating an authoritative and trustworthy environment for the online content of the Dutch Police. It also has a positive impact on the national security of the Dutch government.

Accordingly, the application of Code of Conduct to protect other registrants is not required.

Registry Operator represents that the registration policies attached hereto as Schedule A are a true and correct copy of the Registry Operator’s registration policies for the TLD. Registry Operator agrees to notify ICANN promptly in writing in the event any of the Statements has become untrue (whether before or after an exemption has been granted).

Registry Operator further acknowledges and agrees that the Exemption will be void if at any time any of the Statements has become untrue.

Schedule A

Registry Operator hereby acknowledges that the following are the true and correct registration policies for the TLD:

New .Politie domain names will be granted to the Dutch Police. The Information Technology and Communications division will decide whether the new names proposed by the Dutch Police from the communication and marketing point of view, and whether there are any technical problems connected with the proposed names. If there are multiple applications for the same name, the Information Technology and Communications division will decide who will get the domain name in question. This procedure is already in use and will be published on www.nic.politie.

All registrations under .Politie TLD will be made solely by the Dutch Police. Members of the public and unaffiliated organizations will not be able to register domain names in this new gTLD. All domain names will be granted free of charge, and only to departments of the Dutch Police.
